LETTERS FROM LYNN: OCTOBER 2024

Fall is finally here; the leaves are changing and so are the lives of the children we are serving at Alexander Youth Network. The start of a new school year and the drop in temperature are signs of transition. Webster's defines a transition as "the process or a period of changing from one state or condition to another." This is one of the goals we have for children who struggle with mental and behavioral health challenges. We hope they can transition

from a state of just surviving to thriving, our hope is to see these children blossom, grow and develop the coping skills necessary to transition into adulthood equipped with tools to successfully manage their emotions.

In the last few months, we have opened a new service called Transition House to do just that for a very special group of children. Transition House is for children who have completed a residential treatment program but still need continued support before returning home. This program allows them to continue their treatment in a less restrictive, but structured, environment. They are receiving the mental health treatment they need and are also getting to have a sense of normalcy with activities like attending school, bowling, and going to events in the community. The children at Transition House are able to practice the coping skills they have learned while in residential treatment and experiment in a safe environment with the new skills they have learned. It is a valuable addition to our array of services, allowing children to receive the right kind of care, in the right way and for the right amount of time.

Life transitions can be difficult at any stage or age in life. At Alexander we want to help make those transitions smoother for not only the children we serve but our teammates as well. As we go through these transitions, it's important to learn from all the stages and phases of our lives. We teach the children we serve to take a breath, think before they speak, meditate, exercise, practice deep breathing techniques and yoga. All these things can help not only children, but everyone. As we transition from summer to fall and into the holidays, let us all remember to take a little time to breathe, talk to a friend, read, or go for a walk. We can successfully navigate life transitions if we do it together.
